ABOUT THE FACILITY

Arenas & Footing

Indoor competition arena 20m x 60m. Indoor warm-up area right next to competition arena. Arenas have dirt footing. Introductory and Training Level tests may be scheduled in small arena. Limited lungeing available. Outdoor lungeing seasonally available.

Camping on grounds

Any vehicle or trailer anywhere on the grounds that is occupied overnight will be charged \$25/night. No additional charge for hook-ups.

Food

Food will be available on grounds *during meal hours only*.

Parking

Unloading/loading only by barns. Overnight trailer parking south side of arena. Please follow posted signage.

Stabling

Box stalls with full doors, first bedding included; additional bedding available for purchase. Please note any stabling requests on entry. **Stalls available after noon on Friday.** Weekend rate includes Friday night through Sunday afternoon.

AWARDS

Prize to first place; ribbons through sixth place.

DIRECTIONS

I-5 north to 179th St./Battle Ground exit (#9). West on 179th. Left on 2nd Ave. at the “Equestrian Entrance” sign. Left into fairgrounds at Equestrian Entrance.

ENTRIES

Be sure to specify division on entry form - i.e. Junior/Young Rider, Adult Amateur or Open. Unspecified division on entry will be considered Open. Please include copies of ODS membership card

SCHEDULING & RIDE TIMES

State on your entry if you are unable to ride on a specific day. Ride times will be e-mailed to riders 5 to 7 days before show and posted at www.foxvillage.com, however, responsibility for obtaining ride times from show management remains with the competitor. Class scheduling may require changing the order of classes. Management reserves right to drop or combine classes, substitute judges or change classes to another day.

OTHER

Local show rules may apply; check with show management. Riders encouraged to wear protective headgear while mounted. Entries will not be accepted without full payment and proper signatures. No phone/fax entries. Entries postmarked by closing date may purchase scratches without penalty. Dogs must be leashed and children supervised by an adult.

Dressage Trail Class: to be considered a fun class. The trail class is ridden and judged similarly to a standard dressage test. Horses receive scores in traditional areas such as accuracy and submission, but they must maintain their composure while doing unusual tasks like trotting over rails, circling with one hand on the reins. Ridden in 20 x 40 meter arena; to be ridden in a snaffle.
